### CALL FOR PROPOSALS

**DEADLINE: FRIDAY JUNE 16<sup>TH</sup>, 2023**

The Department of Psychiatry at Queen's University is accepting abstracts for its Annual Research Day on **Thursday, September 21, 2023**. This year the conference will be a full-day and held in-person at the Donald Gordon Conference Centre. The program (see attached) is entirely new and is designed to involve and engage the wider Department and members with different interests and expertise.

Junior faculty, students, residents and trainees are encouraged to participate by submitting an abstract for presentation for either the **Oral Symposium** or **Poster**.

### Oral Symposium

The oral presentations will be included in the Symposium section of the program. These should be brief presentations of scholarly work. Presentations will be 10 minutes in length, followed by 5 minutes for a question-and-answer period.

### Instructions

- Submit an Abstract structured as follows:
  - Title
  - Authors (underline name of presenting author (junior faculty/trainees/residents are encouraged to present))
  - Font: Calibri, size 12
  - Abstract must be submitted in PDF Format
  - Maximum 250 words

  - Objective
  - Activities / Method / Innovations
  - Outcomes / Results / Lessons Learned
  - Conclusion
- Submissions must include:
  - 2 learning objectives
  - 3 Key Words

The selection committee will choose from the submitted abstracts which to include in the oral presentations as part of the Symposium at Research Day. Selection will be based on forming a balanced program in terms of topics and presenters. Young researchers, residents and early career scholars are encouraged to present. Guidelines and requirements for the oral presentations will be sent to the selected participants. Abstracts not selected for an oral presentation will be encouraged to present their research as a poster presentation.

### Poster Presentations

The Poster presentation is formatted for participants to deliver their research in a brief amount of time with a single static slide. Poster presentations give participants the chance to share new research initiatives and provide a snapshot of their work and showcase the importance of their research in a matter of minutes.

When the competition is being conducted, each participant should be ready in front of his/her poster to answer all questions from the judges. The judges will come to your poster during poster presentations. You will be given about 5-7 minutes to present your poster including questions and answers. Judges may pose questions during the evaluation of the poster. The presentation schedule will be informed to you once the program is finalized.

Apart from the judging time you may also be present at the poster to share your research with interested delegates.

### Instructions for Poster Presentations

  - Authors (underline name of presenting author)
  - Font: Calibri, size 12
  - Abstract must be submitted in PDF Format
  - Maximum 250 words

  - Objective

- Submissions must include:
  - 2-3 learning objectives
  - 3 Key Words

The posters will be evaluated on the significance, impact, and clarity of research. Young investigators, trainees and residents are encouraged to submit posters. Guidelines and requirements for the poster presentations will be sent after the abstracts have been reviewed and selection has been finalized. The abstracts will be evaluated on significance, impact, and clarity of research.
